From the Pastor's Pen....

December is here and that means that we get to celebrate Christmas. During this time of year we often hear songs like, "I'm Dreaming of a White Christmas," or "All I Want For Christmas is My Two Front Teeth." It is really easy to tame and subdue Christmas and we miss the radical and revolutionary nature of Christmas. Yes Christmas is easily reduced to things like trees, wreaths, and gifts. Those are fun and it is okay. Yet the radical nature of Christmas is Jesus, the King, has come.



Read Luke 1: 26 - 33 for a moment: "Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the descendants of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming in, he said to her, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was very perplexed at this statement, and kept pondering what kind of salutation this was. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; for you have found favor with God." And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end." This is the account of Angel Gabriel's visit to Mary.

What do you notice about Mary?

Well she was from **Nazareth**. Nazareth was a tiny, "off the beaten path" town and had a reputation that only the "riff-raff" and the poor lived there. One of the disciples Jesus called to follow Him was named Nathanael. Prior to following Jesus, Nathanael was skeptical and said, "**Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?"** He was skeptical because **Nazareth** was just an obscure little town on a hill.

Mary was also a virgin.

Mary was also **engaged to be married**. To be married was a two-step process. The first step was betrothal. Betrothal was more of a business transaction between two families than a personal, romantic choice. A dowry or "bride price" agreement was included and if the betrothal was broken, repayment of the dowry was required. After the betrothal period then there would be the wedding celebration, the bride's move into the groom's house, and the consummation of the marriage. Mary was betrothed or **engaged** and was willing to be in a lifelong committed marriage. And we also see that...

Mary was engaged to **Joseph** a descendant of King **David, and he was likely a poor fellow.** And...

Mary was **favored by God** and **God was with her** – God, through the angel, declared and regarded Mary to be a special object of His favor. God has chosen her in His mercy and special favor to bring forth Jesus. And...

Mary was told she would conceive a child named **Jesus.** The whole gospel is wrapped up in the name of Jesus. His name means "Yahweh saves" or "Yahweh is salvation." Transliterated from Hebrew and Aramaic, the name is Yeshua, and

it means, "rescue," "deliver," or "save." His name means, "The Lord is salvation." In every way, **Jesus** lives up to His **name**. The name *Jesus* reminds us of the power, presence, and purpose of the risen Christ. It assures us that God's gracious intention is to save us. Our Lord Jesus brought God to humanity and now brings humans to God through the salvation of Jesus. And the angel says:

Mary's son would be great and called the Son of the Most high, and He would reign on the throne of David and would have a Kingdom without end.



December is a busy month for many of us. Here is a list of what is taking place here at Hunters Ridge this month.


