A phrase is being thrown around today called The Great Resignation, or it is also known as the Big Quit. What this describes a trend in which employees are voluntarily resigning from their jobs, and they are resigning at greater levels than has been een in a long time. Why are people resigning from their jobs? One reason is many people can now work remotely; they can

A second reason for the great resignation is people want to gain a better balance between work life and their personal life. Work can often interfere with one's pri ate life, and one's private life can interfere with work. People are looking for a etter balance between their work life and their private life

A third reason for the great resignation may be because of the stimulus payment from the government and unemployment benefits people have received. Thos with low paying jobs may have been able to survive and stay at home because of some of these payments.
A fourth reason and perhaps one of the more obvious reasons is because people are discontented with their work. They are simply not finding any satisfaction in heir job.

What ever the reasons may be; a "great resignation" or "big quit" is taking place in the workforce today. In my lifetime I have known people who are doctors, awyers, and people that drive big machinery on farms. I have known school teachers, coaches and people who sell insurance and real estate. I have known dentists, missionaries and other pastors, and so much more. And while so many of them have grown and thrived in their field of work, many also have had a hard time finding work that matters.
Jobs begin to matter when we connect those jobs to Jesus. Even the mundane jobs can matter when we connect them to Jesus. For a job to matter we have to see that what we are doing is much more than just making money. Jesus had vison for us that is about more than just money and possessions. He said, But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." (Matthew 6:33) When Jesus begins to shape who we ate and what life is about, it turns us from people who just strive to make money and have more things, into people who use their jobs to serve Jesus and others.

Paul told us about a different way to approach our work. In Colossians 3:17 he said, "And whatever your do in work or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father." Paul is encouraging us to do our work heartily for the Lord rather than just for yourself. In everything I do I need to learn to invite Jesus to be my co-worker. God wants me to invite Him into everything I do. He wants me to speak and act and move and invite Him into all of that. And by doing that I expect God to direct me, instead of just doing it all on my own.
How can you see your work or occupation right now as something that matters? Your work may seem exhausting and your schedule may seem unpredictable and chaotic. How can you transform your occupation into something that matters in the Kingdom of God? Think on these Scriptures that speak about our work life:
Deuteronomy 15:10, "You shall generously give to him, and your heart shall not be grieved when you give to him, because for this thing the Lord your God will bless you in all your work and in all your undertakings.
2 Thessalonians 3:13, "But as for you, brethren, do not grow weary of doing good."
Colossians 3:23, "Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men."
