

From the Pastor's Pen....

A favorite verse for many people is Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight." The word trust is used in the OT in two ways. First, to literally lean upon something or someone for support. Secondly, to have a sense of wellbeing and security that results from having someone to support you



The Psalm writer is using the word **trust** in the second sense, encouraging us to trust God and to lean upon God for support and security. The psalm writer encourages us to trust, **with all our heart.** He is not talking about trusting God with half of our heart or with a small portion of our heart. He wants us to trust God with **all** of our heart; to do so with a full commitment to act and lean on God for support and security.

Proverbs 3:5-6 teaches us to trust God and yet in reality we often place our trust in some false securities. We may say we trust God but in our day to day functioning it is easy to trust in other things. We trust in our possessions thinking if we have enough money we will be safe and secure. Some people trust in their own potential for greatness. Some people trust in the government. The writer of this Psalm says that the object of the secure trust is the Lord who is a reliable object of confidence.

If you are a follower of Jesus it is still easy to **lean on our own understanding** and even walk in crooked paths instead of **straight paths**. When we choose to align ourselves with the wisdom of the world or trust in our own lives, we walk down crooked paths. Crooked paths so often lead to frustration, defeat, and joylessness.

When we **trust** God then in all our ways we can **acknowledge Him**. We can recognize God in all of our ways and in all of our circumstances. It means we give Him the honor and yield to Him and His leadership in the circumstances and choices of life.

When we **trust** God, He can make our **paths straight**. God can help us make godly decisions. God can help us is the words we use when talking to others. He can direct us in how we spend our money, or how we treat other people. God can help redirect our goals and ambitions. When we choose to align ourselves with God, then whatever we say and whatever we do it can have an eternal impact.

When I **trust** God I learn to lean on His wisdom instead of my own. When we think we know better than God it can easily lead to bad decisions.

And bad decisions can easily lead to crooked paths. It is important that we allow God's thinking and priorities to shape our lives.

Let me clarify something: Success and straight paths don't mean easy paths. God's straight paths will not always be easy paths, they can often be hard. However they are still straight paths because they lead to the will of God for your life. I know this may be hard to digest but sometimes God's will is for us to struggle. God uses struggle to change us and transform us.

I pray the following verses can be an encouragement to you:

Isaiah 26:4, "Trust in the Lord forever, for in God the Lord, we have an everlasting Rock."

Jeremiah 29:13, "You will seek Me and find Me when you search for Me with all your heart."

Psalm 48:14, "For such is God, our God forever and ever; He will guide us until death."

Please know that I love you and desire that we all become more like Jesus.




Membership Class

Christ the King office to arrange a drop off. This program is such a blessing for children and adults.


