From the Pastor's Pen....

Psalm 16:8 says, "I have set the Lord continually before me; because He is at my right hand, I will not be shaken." One of the great sources of insecurity in our lives has to do with the future. The future is utterly unknown to us. We cannot control it, we cannot predict it, and we cannot avoid it. Many people can easily live in the fear of an unknown tomorrow. They try to build stability into their lives by having a good and stable job



and making good money. They try to build stability emotionally as they diet, exercise, eat the right things and get help if there is an emotional issue going on. They plan, work, and strive to anticipate what's coming. The truth is no matter how much we plan, we just don't know what tomorrow will bring.

The author of this Psalm, David, seems to face tomorrow unafraid. He says, "I will not be shaken." How does he maintain this kind of confidence in the face of uncertainty? He says, "I have set the Lord continually before me…"

That is a beautiful phrase I want to dwell on for a moment with you. The late Dr. Dallas Willard wrote, "The ultimate freedom we have as human beings is the power to select what we will allow or require our minds to dwell upon." (Dallas Willard, Renovation of the Heart, pg. 98). What do you allow your mind to dwell on? Today it is easy for our minds to dwell on all that is wrong in our world. We dwell upon the catastrophes that hit parts of our world (war, famine, earthquakes, diseases, etc.) We dwell upon the political news of the day (as we spend much time listening to the news). We see how our world has seemed to lose its moral compass (violence and crime, etc.). Our minds can feed so much on that which seems to offer little hope.

The writer of this Psalm, David, seems to focus on keeping, "...the Lord continually before me..." What is it like to, "...keep the Lord continually before me?" It involves...

- 1. Great reverence toward God and His Son Jesus In heaven there are myriads of angels, saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing." And every created thing which is in heaven and on the earth and under the earth and on the sea, and all things in them, I heard saying, "To Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb, be blessing and honor and glory and dominion forever and ever." Just as the angels worshipped this glorious God in Christ, the focus of our hearts and minds can focus more on God rather than ourselves. It also involves...
- 2. A willingness to allow God's word to be at the forefront of our minds.

Psalm 19:7-8 says, The law of the Lord is perfect, restoring the soul; The testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple. The precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart; The command ment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes." Psalm 119:11 says, Your word I have treasured in my heart, that I may not sin against You." Psalm 119:127-128 says, Therefore I love Your commandments above gold, yes, above fine gold. Therefore I esteem right all Your precepts concerning everything, I hate every false way. And Psalm 119:165 says, "Those who love Your law have great peace, and nothing causes them to stumble." When God's word is at the forefront of our minds we allow His word to influence us and our thinking more than all the noise that goes on around us.


When we set the Lord more and more before us, before our minds and in our hearts, we can have great peace, or as David writes, "I will not be shaken." The Apostle Paul wrote in Philippians 4:8, "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, let your mind dwell on these things." One of the fundamental ways we set our minds at peace is when we fill our minds with His word. May we not be shaken!

Please know that I love you and desire that we all become more like Jesus.
